Literally theology within Islam recognizes that religious varieties constitute part of divine wisdom. Surah Al-Ma'idah (5:48) states: "To each of you, we have prescribed a law and a clear way. If Allah had willed, He would have made you one nation, but (He intended) to test you on what He has given you. So, compete in good deeds."⁵
